

A Change of Plans...

Most of you know that I am deep into my second year of the Wabash Pastoral Leadership Program, a professional growth opportunity for Indiana pastors made possible by the Lilly Endowment. I have gathered with, and will continue to gather with a cohort of pastors to do in-depth study of many different topics that affect quality of life here in Indiana. The time to study and reflect has been a gift, and I continue to pray for clarity on which of the many, many ideas I've come across are the right fit to help Holy Shepherd be a blessing to our community.

A highlight of this past year was our trip to the US-Mexico border at McAllen, Texas and Reynosa, Tamaulipas, Mexico. Being there in person and seeing the situation up close brought a level of insight I could not hope to have gained by studying the situation from afar. Many of you joined me for my presentation on this eye-opening trip.

Our plan for this year was to travel to Ireland and explore the ways that country has been teaching about dealing with trauma in the wake of extended periods of violence. At our most recent gathering, however, our director informed us there has been a change of plans. We are no longer traveling to Ireland. We will be going to the West African nation of Ghana instead.

We will be studying the traditions of storytelling among the various cultures in Ghana and assessing how those practices can tell an alternative story to the prevailing view of things. In my mind, there is a clear parallel to Jesus' ministry. Jesus did a lot of storytelling to counter the prevailing views of how the world worked and what God's priorities were. He called this alternative view the kingdom of God.

I am hopeful that this experience can help me continue to hone and expand my skills as a pastor and deepen my faith as a fellow Christian. I also have the sense that simply experiencing a country so distinctly different than the United States will expand my horizons, widen my perspective, and hopefully provide some great preaching material along the way.

I would ask for everyone's prayers for safe travels and that the Holy Spirit will open my eyes and my heart to what God needs me to see in West Africa this fall.

looking for a crew of volunteers who are enthusiastic, creative, and dedicated to making a positive impact on the children who will be participating.


